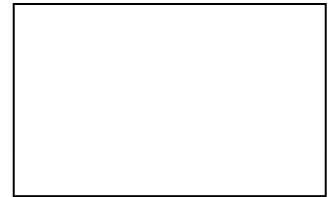

THIS APPLICATION MUST BE FILED WITH THE AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB AT LEAST 4 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE TRIAL DATE. A CLUB HOLDING A SANCTIONED FIELD TRIAL MAY NOT ADVERTISE OR PUBLISH THE DATE OF ANY FIELD TRIAL UNTIL THIS DATE HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE AKC.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SANCTIONED EVENTS

There are two types of Sanctioned Events: Informal Sanctioned Trials, and Qualifying Sanctioned Trials.

An Informal Sanctioned Trial is one at which dogs compete but not for Championship points, held by a club, by applying for, and obtaining the Sanction of the American Kennel Club. Results and/or reports of these trials are not required to be filed with the AKC.

Qualifying Sanctioned Trials are formal field trials at which no Championship points are awarded, and are conducted almost exactly as if they were licensed trials. In order for a club to be eligible to apply for its first licensed trial it is required to hold a minimum of two Qualifying Sanctioned Field Trials at least 6 months apart, and for this type of trial it is necessary, after approval of the dates and judges, to submit a copy of the premium list and entry form which must be prepared by the club following almost the exact format of those used for Licensed Trials. At the conclusion of the judging, Field Trials clubs shall provide the judges with a book containing a page for each class judged with full particulars of all dogs placed. The judges shall sign each page indicating approval of the awards shows. The Field Trial Secretary shall also sign each page certifying to the judges signatures, and to the number of starters in the stake, and shall file said judges book, together with all original entry forms for each dog, and complete report of said trial (the inside cover of judges book) with the American Kennel Club within seven (7) days after closing the trial. Judges books are automatically furnished to the club after their application for a Qualifying Trial has been approved.

A club wishing to use official judges books for Informal Sanctioned Trials may obtain them from the AKC at the cost of \$3.00 each.
